As, here in Western Europe, we approach the key period of the harvest, which will lead to the encapsulation of the 2022 vintage for which we are all longing, it is with great pleasure that I unveil, dear fellow collectors and wine aficionados, the second volume of our *Kipling* series initiated last April. This new format of livestream sales from our *Club 1865 by Baghera* in Geneva has become a privileged showcase for original collections, rare wines that cannot be found elsewhere on the market, a new opportunity for Baghera/wines to honour passionate, dedicated collectors, talented winemakers and wines that convey emotion through an event that celebrates the exceptional, the outstanding, the singular, the unique...

On Sunday October 16, you will have access to one of the most impressive collections of Burgundy wines that Romandy Switzerland has ever seen: “*Pure Burgundy, the singular Swiss cellar of wine collector Dr. Romain Doglia*”. Introduced to the great French wines, and more particularly to those of Burgundy, by his father, a humble wine and mineral water merchant from Fribourg, Romain started from an early age to develop a passion for the great Pinots Noirs and Chardonnays which he has been tasting, buying, drinking, comparing and re-tasting ever since this passion began. Romain has travelled extensively in neighbouring Burgundy, and has fallen for this exceptional region where sensory pleasures and the perpetuation of savoir-faire coexist in a quest for emotion, conviviality, experience and excellence.

Excellence: this is also the term that befits the collection offered to you through this remarkable private collection, illustrating in itself the most eminent names in winegrowing Burgundy.

From 1937 to 2016, some 80 years of Burgundy viticulture are reflected with youth and brilliance in the bottles chosen by Romain Doglia for our Kipling sale. This

selection of more than 600 bottles and magnums from his personal cellar is a tribute to the mythical Burgundy wines that have exhilarated him for so many years and that he has cleverly acquired and patiently pampered for his own pleasure and that of his children and friends, as well as that of some major Geneva-based companies that have called on him for numerous VIP dinners in the past two decades : Clos des Lambrays 1937, Musigny Bouchard Aîné 1959 magnum, Grands-Echézeaux René Engel 1985, Romanée-Conti 1988 magnum, Montrachet Ramonet 1989, Cros-Parantoux Henri Jayer 1990, Chambertin Leroy 1993, Charmes-Chambertin Jacky Truchot 1995, Chambertin Rousseau 1999, Chevalier-Montrachet d’Auvénay 1999, Corton-Charlemagne Coche-Dury 2001, Montrachet Leflaive 2005, La Tâche 2010...

As you will have understood, this October sale is solely dedicated to Burgundy and reflects only a very small part of Dr. Romain Doglia’s extensive collection. That is why I am doubly pleased to announce that many other exceptional bottles illustrating the finest signatures of the French vineyards and the rest of the world will be put up for auction in our important end-of-year sale scheduled for 27 November 2022. Amongst the wines on offer there will be an important selection of mature wines, rare formats and vintages impossible to find on the market, all from the Swiss cellar of Dr. Romain Doglia.

guide for bidders

online live bidding

Place your bids in real time through our online live bidding platform. Please register ahead of the date and connect to www.bagherawines.com on the day of the sale and follow the guide. *B/Live*, Baghera/wines' live auction platform, will relay your bids and give you the opportunity to live the sale as if you were attending it in person. Feel the atmosphere in the room, follow the auction's excitement and place your bids at your convenience – your bids will be instantly relayed to the auctioneer.

B/Live is accessible from computers and mobile devices, all you need is to ensure that your connection is sufficient to support live video streaming. If not, you will still be able to bid live (without the video) as the current bid and next increment will be visible on the screen.

You will need to register at least 48h prior to the sale on www.bagherawines.com to ensure registration is complete before the sale, and confirmed. You will be able to enter the sale and place your bids at your convenience. Please note that credit controls apply on these bids.

absentee bids

Leave your absentee bids ahead of the sale on our website and online-catalogue. Connect to www.bagherawines.com. You will need to register at least 48h prior to the sale on www.bagherawines.com to ensure registration is complete and your absentee bids are confirmed.

You may also give Baghera/wines instructions to bid on your behalf by writing to office@bagherawines.com. Our staff members will then try to purchase the lot(s) of your choice for the lower price possible. Please note this service is free, totally confidential and offered as a convenience to clients. Although our representative will make every effort, Baghera/wines will not be responsible for error or failure to execute bids.

buyer's premium

The maximum bid price that you provide during your bidding process is the hammer price only. If you are successful on a lot, a **buyer's premium of 22%** will be added to the hammer price for each lot you buy. An additional VAT tax of 7.7% will be levied on the hammer price AND buyer's premium.

successful bids

Successful bidders will be notified and invoiced within a few days of the sale.

bidding increments

Bidding generally opens with the low estimate and advances in increments of up to 10% subject to the auctioneer's discretion.

The auctioneer retains the right to call bids at his own discretion but the following will give buyers an indication of the normal bid steps:
